

Lessons from the Story of Job

"I have heard of You by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees You." (Job 42)

- 1. In v3, Job says that he has uttered what he did not understand, things too wonderful for him. What does he mean when he says that the things he has uttered are too wonderful for him?**
- 2. What leads Job to repent in dust and ashes? Have you had similar experiences?**
- 3. How might Job's understanding of God have changed?**
- 4. How might Job's relationship with God have changed?**
- 5. In v8, God addresses Eliphaz and his two companions and tells them how and why they are to repent. What specifically does the Lord say about their sins and why do you think the Lord made their forgiveness conditional upon Job's prayers?**
- 6. V10 tells us that when Job prayed for his friends, the Lord restored his losses. Why do you think the Lord waited until then?**
- 7. The Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before, blessed his latter days, and let Job die old and full of days. How do you think Job's attitude towards the Lord's blessings might have changed from before the time of his trial?**
